2. Request by T•Mobile for utility easement under Great Western Trail Lodge siting update, possible action:

The attached easement, discussed at the December 2018 Warren County Conservation Board meeting, has been reviewed by the County Attorney's Office. The Attorney's Office found no problems with the attached language.

Joe Gavin moved to approve the easement as presented and authorize the President to sign. Second by Ron Miller. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

3. Lodge siting:

The Board indicated that the site on the Lawson tract was preferred over the lower, wetland

adjacent site. The Board also indicated a preference for a corner (approximately 15-acre) parcel over the smaller (approximately 8-acre) lot. The larger lot would eliminate the need for a permanent easement for access.

Including a changing room and a closet for chairs and tables was discussed. The decrease in open space that these amenities could cause was a concern. Ron Miller estimated that increasing the footprint of the structure to compensate would cost \$40/square foot. Costs associated with removing a portion of Mr. Lawson's property from CRP, and potential contract conflicts that might cause, were discussed. Mr. Lawson has met with US Department of Agriculture personnel and will soon have answers to those questions.

- 4. Decision on using interns for butterfly surveys:

  After a brief discussion, there were no motions on the intern question.
