i. Reading of the Minutes

- a. Warren County Conservation Board meeting minutes from the regular January meeting, Work Session January 26, 2022, and Special Meeting January 28, 2022, were reviewed. - b.. Sue Boll made a motion to approve the January Regular Meeting, with the correction of times for the closed sessions, Work Session, and Special Meeting minutes. Ace Hendricks seconded the motion with the corrections. All ayes. Motion carried.

ii. Organization

- a. By-Laws
 - i. Karen Johlas-Szalkowski questioned moving the Office Manager under the direct supervision of Co-Director/Operations Coordinator.
 - ii. There was a change in wording and it not showing up under Co-Director/Naturalist II's position. The wording makes it sound like Co-Director/Operations Coordinator

- is managing the entire budget. Karen Johlas-Szalkowski would like to have manages environmental education budget added under Co-Director/Naturalist II.
- iii. Mark Kickbush suggested the Office Manger move their workstation to the front desk. The board would like to have visitors greeted as they come in the building.
- iv. Sue Boll made a motion to accept the by-laws with changes made to the office manager position being supervised directly by Co-Director/Operations Coordinator and Co-Director/Naturalist II overseeing the environmental education line items in the budget. - b. Joe Schettler is interested in the plan or big items in motion and where those projects stand as opposed to induvial staff reports. He feels it's up to the supervisors to take care of the employee monthly reports.

iv. Business Agenda

a. Old Business

- i. Friends of Warren County Conservation Board (FWCC)
 - Friends have started working on planning the prairie picnic. They are reaching out to local business for the live and silent auction items. They will be going back to the live auction at the event.
 - 2. They have recently started a book club. The first one when well.
 - They selected their officers for the year, approved their by-laws, approved financial policy, approved their credit card policy, and added on three new board members.
 - 4. They have reached out to local business to sponsor the Osprey 5K that will be hosted at the Annett Nature Center on Saturday April 9th.

ii. Middleswart Lodge Update

- 1. Fire Chief Chia sent the final paperwork for the board to sign.
- 2. Karen Johlas-Szalkowski purchased two more tables making seating available for 100 people with 104 chairs.
- 3. Mark Wilson got a quote to fix the kitchen door. It came back at \$3,301.00. At some point this door will need to be replaced. There may be funds at the end of the year to utilize or this could fall under infrastructure and funds from the reserve fund used to replace the door.

v. New Business

- a. 2023 Budget
 - Co-Directors Wilson and Johlas-Szalkowski presented the fiscal year '23 budget to the Warren County Board of Supervisors on Thursday January 13, 2022. They presented a budget in the amount of \$906,31.00.
- b. Warren County Conservation Board Mission Statement
 - i. Mark Kickbush would like to review the mission statement for where we're headed.
- c. Warren County Conservation Vision Statement
 - i. President Kickbush would like to review the vision statement.
- d. Strategic Plan

i. The board discussed how the strategic plan was created in the past. They wondered what the citizen of Warren County would like to see as goals for Warren County Conservation. In the past the board has helped write the strategic plan and they are more than willing to help with the new plan. At this time the Co-Directors are the only two that have worked to create the current Strategic Plan.

e. Rental Fees for Annett Nature Center

- Joe Schettler made the motion to increase the rental rate for Annett Nature Center to \$750.00 per calendar day, with a \$1000.00 damage deposit. Sue Boll seconded the motion. All ayes. Motion Carries.
- ii. Joe Schettler made the motion to give all Friends of Warren County Conservation, at the \$50.00 benefactor level, a reduced rate of \$600.00 per calendar day, once per calendar year. Sue Boll seconded. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

f. Grass Drill Rental Rate

i. Joe Schettler made the motion to change the drill rental rate to \$100.00 and \$100.00 for a deposit. Sue Boll seconded the motion. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

g. Volunteer Waiver of Liability & Indemnity

i. Ron Miller made the motion to approve the "Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement Concerning the Warren County Conservation Board" as presented. Ace Hendricks seconded the motion. All Aye. Motion carried.

vi. Discussion Items

a. ARPA Funds Update

- i. The Warren County Board of Supervisors approved the ARPA application for a new truck. Tyler Seuferer was able to secure a truck and get it purchased. The total cost will be \$53,000.00. It will be 6 to 8 weeks until delivery.
- ii. Crystal McIntyre spoke with Mark Wilson to see what could be shifted from the budget to utilize ARPA funds to pay for. Mark Wilson suggested \$12,200.00 for limestone steps and \$24,000.00 for the water feature in front of the Annett Nature Center.

b. Great Western Trail Update

i. Still waiting on getting the agreement for the board to sign. They are thinking about letting out the bids on June 21, 2022 with construction starting August 1, 2022.

vii. Financial Report
